ONEG SHABBAT GUIDELINES

ESSENTIAL ITEMS and JUD /KOSHER NOTES

- Challah, please bring one loaf of your choice.
- Kedem, is preferred and provided by Temple Sinai.
- Food and beverage to celebrate the Shabbat! Pork and shellfish are prohibited. Where possible, meat and dairy should be separated. Kosher certification is not required. There are various dietary concerns within our congregation, please do use the food labels we've provided for you.
- If you have questions or need assistance, call Temple Sinai at 775-747-5508.
- If you are unable to host the scheduled oneg, please call ASAP!

SET UP 30 MINUTES BEFORE SERVICE

Shabbat services generally begin at 7:30 p.m. The *synagogue* is open one-half hour before the start of services.

TEMPLE SINAI HAS THE FOLLOWING BUT FEEL FREE TO BRING YOUR OWN

Tablecloths; *challah* trays and covers; serving trays and utensils, plates, bowls; and cups; disposable tableware and cutlery, coffee and filters. The large coffee urn must be completely assembled for both brewing coffee and heating water. Temple Sinai also has sugar, sweeteners, non-dairy creamer, coffee, tea, and cocoa.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANUP

Temple Sinai's *Shabbat shamas*, is here to open and lock the synagogue only. The *shamas* can direct you to the location of items in the kitchen but she is not responsible for setup or cleanup.

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Clean Up Checklist

- 1. Leftover food can be used for future *onegs*. Plate freezable leftovers, ready to set out. Over-wrap with plastic wrap then foil then date and freeze.
- 2. If left over food is not appropriate to freeze, please take it home or place on smaller plate, cover with plastic wrap then date and refrigerate for hungry persons/snacks/nosh.
- 3. You may leave unopened beverages on the counter or in the refrigerator. Opened beverages, including carbonated beverages should be discarded.
- 4. **No wine** is to be served to minors, or left in the refrigerator or kitchen. Please, take it home.
- 5. Be sure to empty coffee makers. Place glass coffee urn, plastic basket, coffee pot stem and basket in dishwasher. Let metal coffee maker dry upside down in dish drainer.
- 6. Be sure all ovens and burners are turned OFF.
- 7. **Start dishwasher before leaving**. Use dishwasher for all washing; including plastics, trays, cups, plates, and utensils. Both dishwashers can run at the same time.
- 8. Recycle! Flatten cans and flatten plastic bottles then place in recycle bin.
- 9. Take trash to the outside dumpster unless dumpster is full. Reline trash receptacles. All food trash must be securely closed in plastic trash bags before placing in dumpster. If dumpster is full, leave trash in the kitchen. Please place a "dumpster full" note in the administrative mailbox in the synagogue lobby. Temple Sinai is fined for trash left outside the dumpster.
- 10. Please take the used tablecloths and towels home to launder. We do not have laundry service. No ironing needed if neatly folded. Be sure to return them.
