The Holocaust and the Rise of Antisemitism in the 21st Century

Despite the hope of "Never Again," ignorance about the Holocaust abounds and Antisemitism is on the rise. This year's *Day of Remembrance* program will honor the past and explore the current threats to our nation and the world.

Mitka Kalinski was a very young Jewish child in Eastern Europe when WWII began in 1939. After several concentration camps, he ended up as a household slave on the farm of a German officer who kept him there until 1949, when Mitka was liberated. His unique story of survival is a testament to the human spirit.



Dennis Dworkin, professor and chair, Department of History at the University of Nevada, Reno, has a doctorate in modern history from the University of Chicago. A historian of Britain and Ireland with a speciality in cultural theory, he also teaches courses in European, Italian and Jewish history.
