Eighth Grade Mitzvah Project

Overview

The Eighth Grade Mitzvah Project program is a mentorship opportunity for 8th grade students who wish to continue their Jewish journey beyond b'nei mitzvah. Building on the foundation of the friendships that began in Sinai School, students who have completed their bar/bat mitzvah are invited to embark on their own Mitzvah Project that can include anything from serving as a teaching assistant, to helping design the Temple's outdoor sanctuary, to directing their own Purimshpiel, to heading up a food drive campaign with a friend at the shul...the sky is the limit! Once students decide what they want to do, they will pair up with a mentor at the temple who can guide the students' independent learning and help them give back to the community in meaningful ways.

Requirements

Eighth Grade Mitzvah students meet as a large group two Sundays a month for 2-3 hours at a time - once for a social outing (rollerskating, go-karts, slime lab, bowling, the mall, etc.) and once for a "planning Sunday" to plan their next social outing, listen to guest speakers, and check-in with the director about their Mitzvah Project progress. Additionally, students will plan and host a Shabbat dinner once a month that rotates between eighth grade family homes and is open to students and families who are available. Planning for this monthly meal will also take place on the "planning Sunday" at Temple Sinai and will involve communication with parents who are hosting or helping with these dinners.

For their individual Mitzvah Projects, each student's time requirements will follow the needs of their family's schedule and the schedule of the student's mentor at the temple. As a general guideline, 8th graders are expected to help out in the temple during the school year at least once a month outside of the two large-group Sundays to complete their Mitzvah Project. Once paired up with a mentor, students and families will need to coordinate with the mentor to establish a regular schedule and line of communication.

Preparation

Before applying for the Eight Grade Mitzvah program, students and parents should read over the Mitzvah Project Ideas document and fill out the Mitzvah Project Survey before meeting with Director Josie about their placement in a mentorship.

Cost

The Eighth Grade Mitzvah program costs \$350 for members and \$700 for non-members for the entire school year (two semesters). Scholarships are available upon request. Costs do not include outings that exceed \$15 per student or the cost of Shabbat dinners, though Jewish Nevada and PJ Library funding are available for offsetting these costs for families.
